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Dear Year 4 Families,

Throughout the year all children at Puddletown first have personal, social, health and economic education (PSHE) through our 'Jigsaw' curriculum. This has built children's emotional literacy, self-esteem and knowledge of who they are and how they relate to each other and the world in a positive and healthy way.

In the second half of the Summer term we cover the unit called 'changing Me' and base our teaching on that. We are aware that with the increasingly early onset of maturity for some pupils it is important to cover these topics so that they are prepared for any changes that may be happening.

We hope you will be in agreement with us that this work is vitally important for children and that it needs to be delivered age-appropriately. However if you feel that it is not appropriate for your child at this time you have the right to withdraw from the 2 lessons that cover puberty and naming of the adult reproductive system ( we do not cover the reproductive act) These 2 sessions will be taught over one afternoon with boys and girls taught separately on the **Tuesday 2nd July.** The Lesson plan will be available on request from Monday 24th June should you require them.

## Parents' right to request their child be excused from Sex Education

## From our policy '

At Puddletown First School, puberty is taught as a statutory requirement of Health Education and covered by our Jigsaw PSHE Programme in the 'Changing Me' unit. We conclude that sex education refers to Human Reproduction, and therefore inform parents of their right to request their child be withdrawn from the PSHE lessons that explicitly teach this i.e. the Jigsaw Changing Me unit e.g. Year 4 girls and puberty and having a baby.

As a parent/carer you have the right to withdraw your child from the elements of the topic that cover 'sex education and must inform the school of your decision. Please use school comms to do this. If we **do not** receive a withdrawal email by **Friday 28th of June** we will assume that consent has been given, and your child will take part in this lesson.
